- 11 Following have been observed during the Memory of Man (Viz:) The Vicar Receives for every Buriall five pence for every Marriage twelve
- 12 Pence for every Churching five pence for Mortuary According to the Statute, One Pig at Seven without allowance given for odd ones under
- 13 Ten or taken above ten and under Seventeen Two Pigs at Seventeen; ----- One Goose at Seven in like sort excepting that the Customary time
- 14 For payment thereof is at Midsummer hemp and flax is paid twice in the Year According to the Severall Seasons of their Growth
- 15 Without Seed when it is dry after the Watering the tenth part At the feast of St. Peter Wool and Lambs are due and payable According
- 16 To the Custom which is one at Every Seven both of Lambs and fleeces which is to be Chosen by the Vicar Two of the best Being first set apart by
- 17 The Owner Two at Seventeen three at twenty seven ----- AND allowance given or taken for the odd ones at Easter following as is hereafter

- 18 Mentioned for Wool and Lamb of Sheep kept out of the Parish Under thirty days is paid to the full Tythes According to the aforesaid Custome
- 19 Kept out aney longer than Proportionably According to the Law, At the feast of Easter is paid yearly as followeth Two Eggs for every laying hen
- 20 For Odd Lambs and fleeces that happened at Midsummer Last for every fleece a farthing and for every Lamb an halfe penny To be allowed by the
- 21 Vicar if above Seaven and under Ten or above Seventeen and under Twenty ---- by the Parishoner If under Seaven or above Ten and under
- 22 Seventeen ---- for Oblations is paid for every Married Person Widdower or Widdow Two pence for every Single person one penny
- 23 By every man that Exercises Handicraft or Mannuall Occupation four pence, for every Stall of Bees killed a penny for every
- 24 Colt foled a penny for house Duty is paid two pence half penny which is thus Wreckoned for Garden Stuff a penny, for fruit a penny
- 25 For fewell an halfpenny Which house Duty is so Paid by every Householder whether he be sole Master of an ancient Messuage or of part
- 26 Thereof or Cottager that hath had hath or may have such things, for every Cow which the Owner hath had for thirty days Together at any time
- 27 Of the year which is Reckoned from the feast of St. Martin the Bishop was Twelve Months to the said feast of St. Martin Last
- 28 Past a penny, for every Calf under Seven and above ten and under Seventeen ----- an halfe Penny for Wages Men Servants pay three pence
- 29 And Maid Servants two pence beside their Offering penny Which is in all Men Servants four pence and Maid Servants Three Pence
- 30 Tythe ------ is paid as followeth Viz for the Tenements in the holding of the Persons here after Named
